campaign will support Memorial Hospital's Behavioral Health Team as they work to launch a new mobile unit, Memorial Medical Clinic Mobile. This mobile clinic will allow mental health professional counselors to provide students with needed support, therapy, and resources, directly on their school's campus. This mobile unit is licensed to serve children ages 4 through 18 throughout Hancock County and beyond.

Between 25% and 33% of adolescents forgo needed care, and many others lack access (NCCP, 2024).
